From the Principal:

Term one has been jam packed full of activity at school. Beginning with the approval of our name change early on in the term and the continuation of our extensive building program, we certainly are experiencing lots of positive change. Yesterday Anita and I took a tour of the new buildings and were excited to see that the new carpet has been laid, windows installed and painting finished. The cabinetry is currently being built off site, and will be installed in May but in the meantime the interior of the other end of the building and the refurbishment of the toilets will be continued. We are still on schedule to have the building completed and handed over during mid May.

Our professional learning program continued last week with our whole staff attending a talk by educator Glenn Pearsall. This was a very engaging experience for all of our teachers and provided them with a tool kit of strategies to gather formative assessment data that informs us about learning progress that individual students are making.

Our Integration Aides spent last Thursday developing their professional practice through attending a full day session on mental health first aid. This important area of their work was supported through this development and will ultimately assist in understanding and responding to this complex issue.

Today our students have enjoyed Asian Celebration Day. This is always a time when they (and the teachers), enjoy dressing up, playing Asian themed games and taste testing some delicious Asian foods. Thanks to Ibu for organinsing this day for us again and bringing the learning of Indonesian language to life in our school.

As this is the last newsletter before the end of term, I would like to give my heartfelt warm wishes to Anita Elliott who is moving on to a promotion as Principal at Heathmont East Primary School. We all know Anita will do a wonderful job there and although we will miss here smiling and caring manner, we are excited about what the future holds for her.

From the Assistant Principal:

Feedback as learning for students.

Last Thursday, the teaching staff from Victoria Road ventured into the Melbourne Convention Centre, attending a professional learning day led by educational consultant, Glen Pearsall. We all came away feeling enthusiastic and with improved knowledge and how we can more effectively engage our students in their own learning through timely feedback.

Feedback is a form of assessment that provides teachers with the information they need to focus their teaching on the students' point of need. Simple strategies implemented in the classroom allow teachers and students to interact in a timely manner on both how well the teacher's instructions and information are being received and how well a student is comprehending and able to act on what is being asked of them. A simple, agreed hand gesture a student gives to a teacher may give an understanding of how a student has comprehended verbal instructions, and if there is a need for a whole class focus or individual assistance.

We are all very excited to be putting a range of strategies in place in classrooms to improve our students' learning outcomes.

As this is the last time I will contribute to the Victoria Road newsletter I would like to take the opportunity to reflect on the wonderful school we have here. The staff, students and parents work together to create an environment that is caring, nurturing and focused on high student learning growth. It has been a pleasure to have had the opportunity to have worked with everyone and see the school grow and improve.

Foundation:

In Foundation this fortnight we have been carrying on with our alphabet focus through phonics, reading, writing, games and activities. Memory and bingo have been a real hit with the students! Maths has seen us practising our counting skills, number formation and looking at location and giving directions.









Year 1&2:

In Maths we continued to explore the concept of measurement by using balancing scales to compare and match the mass of different objects. We also have been looking at calendars and learning about days of the week, months in the year and seasons.

For Reading we have been focussing on our strengths as a reader and working out which strategies work best for us as individuals e.g. sounding out the words, using picture clues, cross checking etc.

In writing we have been using checklists to help us check our work when editing.











Year 3/4:

Inquiry

Students are currently researching about a country from South America or Africa. They are finding out about things like foods, animals, landmarks, cultural dress, environments, climate, population, language and flags.






