

Foundation:

This month we have been having fun learning about how letters build words and how we can use our knowledge to write sentences and help with Reading . All Foundation students have also been getting active with verbs! In Maths, our focus has been on identifying 2d shapes and even tessellating with them, for discovery and pattern making! A real highlight was our Inquiry fairy tale dress up day where we designed constructions, shared stories and worked with fairy tale music for changing our mood and drawings. Great job everyone!

















Year 1&2:

This week as been very exciting for the ones and twos as we moved into our new classrooms. The students have done an amazing job helping us move and getting use to the new big space that we have. It is really nice to have lots of different spaces and that all the ones and twos are together.

In inquiry the ones and twos have continued to developed their creativity skills by looking at a problem and coming up with a creative way to solve the problem. The challenge that they have been working on is to build a boat that can hold 10 unifix blocks. We looked at why some objects float and some sink. The students then brainstormed some ideas and then designed and built a boat that could float and hold 10 unifix blocks. There were so many different designs and ideas that no two boats looked the same. Testing the boats was lots of fun, as we found out if each boat had worked. It was great to see the students working together and encouraging each other. We are very excited about our upcoming excursion to science works.

















Year 1&2 cont:

There has been some changes to the 1/2 teachers. We wish Miss Katie Gooren all the luck with her new baby and this exciting new chapter in her life. 1/2C now have Miss Jillian Brooks as their new teacher.

Mr Peter Humphreys is the new Assistant Principal so Miss Catherine Vermeltfoort has stepped into his shoes and is teaching 1/2A.

We would like to welcome Jillian and Catherine into our school and hope you will make them feel part of the Victoria Road Primary School family.

This term we have been looking at chance and data in Maths. It was lots of fun collecting data from each other when we surveyed the class and we found out what people liked for breakfast and how many letters were in person's name. We then had to put this information into a column or pie graph use this information to find out what was the average numbers of letters in the student's name in each class.

We have started a new topic in literacy this month which is persuasive writing. We are learning how to persuade someone to change their mind. We have had to learn how to write our opinion and make sure we have reasons and examples to back it up.


Mooroolbark District Cross Country


Cash Payments (if your school accepts cash)


