From the Principal:

Dear school community,

As we come to the close of the school year, we are working to optimise our learning time for students before the long Christmas break. For the remaining 3 weeks of the year, classes will continue as usual for literacy, numeracy and other lessons. Given that, we ask that parents ensure that children are attending school right up until the last day.

Over the last semester in particular, the leadership team has been conducting "learning walks" where we talk with students while they are in their learning sessions about what they are learning and how they can develop their learning through accessing information and assistance. What we have noticed over time is that through the inclusion of clear **Learning Intentions** which are explicitly discussed with the whole class, and Success Criteria that enable students to access the level of work that is appropriate to them; our students have a clearer understanding of their learning. This may not seem like a lot, however, in the development of a thinking culture, one of the most important areas we needed to work on was ensuring that there was a clear difference between what work is and what is learning. After all, work is something that can be finished when the task is done, it can also tend to be viewed as onerous. Learning on the other hand is something that is a building block that results in the improvement of an individual person and helps them to be a contributor. Learning is a continuous process that brings excitement and inspiration. This work will continue for our whole school in 2020 and we look forward to offering opportunities for parents to become more involved in this.

Holiday Learning

As you will all appreciate, over the Christmas break, we often lose some of the progress that we have made in particular areas of the curriculum. Whilst having the opportunity to play and enjoy family events and summer in general is very important, we also recognise that many families are keen to continue some aspect of school learning during this break. This year for the first time, we are putting together a home learning pack for students and their families to access during the break. This should be a fun experience for the children and they are likely to want their parents to join them in working through some of the learning activities. I encourage you all to take a look at what is sent home for the children and help them be best prepared for a fantastic 2020 school year.

From the Principal:

Very shortly we will be issuing a letter to each family outlining who their child's teacher is and the make up of the co-teaching team they will be working with. We are very pleased to announce that most of the co-teaching teams will be the same in 2020 as they were in 2019. Teachers in those teams are pleased to continue the work they have been focussed on in their team's Teaching Sprints in 2019 and building on the expertise of the groups.

Cherry is currently completing her Masters degree in Functional Behaviour Assessment and will be a great asset as a team leader in our school. Joining our team is Brian Clarke, Brian is currently a teacher at Heathmont East Primary School and is experienced in many areas including the teaching of PBS. We are also pleased to welcome Nicole Smith to the team, Nicole is very enthusiastic about becoming part of our Victoria Road Community and has a real interest in thinking curriculum and PBS. Both Brian and Nicole have expressed their enthusiasm in working as part of a co-teaching team.

When you read through the list of staff for 2020, most of you will notice that there is one name that has been on the list for the last 30 years but is not there this time. Janne Malbon has decided that 2019 will be her last year of her teaching service and will be retiring. Janne will have long service leave for the first part of 2020 before retiring part way through the year. Janne has offered many years of service to our school and community and is known and loved by many. We will be sad to see her go but excited for her as she steps into this new part of her life knowing that she will now have plenty of time to enjoy being a grandmother to her little ones and to attend even more Bulldogs games that she is normally dedicated to doing. 


Foundation:














This month we have been carrying on with our active brains and active body focus in Foundation Sport. With many fun activities and challenges we have been learning about basketball, obstacle courses, LEGO, throwing and catching. Our Grade 5/6 buddies are always present to give us a hand and help us with the skills we need to keep improving. Well done Team Foundation!

Year 1&2:

The 1/2's have been busy little bees this month! In literacy, we have exploring poetry and the children are being very creative indeed! Poem types that we have looked at so far include, Alliteration poems, Acrostic poems, Repetitive poems, Haiku poems, colour and senses poems, Rhyming poems and Concrete poems.





In inquiry the 1/2's have been learning how to program the Dash and Dot Robots through an obstacle course designed by them. It's been a blast watching the students design their course and use a trial and error process to improve it or make it more creative. We can see some real thinking happening here!







With the upcoming Grade 1 Fun Night and the Grade 2 Sleepover just around the corner, we are all getting very excited. Looking forward to seeing the wonderful grade 1's and 2's for a night full of fun!

Grade 1/2 Teachers

Year 3/4:

What a busy and exciting year we have had. Still plenty of activities coming up, such as the Run4Fun Colour Explosion and Christmas Family Fun Night.

Plenty of learning has been happening in Year 3/4...

LITERACY

We have been focusing on poetry in reading and writing sessions. Students have been studying various forms of poems, looking at meaning and experimenting with writing their own. So great to see such creativity among the poems!

MATHS

In the last few weeks we have looked at chance activities, designed graphs and practiced gathering information from existing graphs. This week we are focusing on Area & Perimeter. Was great to head out to the basketball court to measure the courts using trundle wheels, then work out their perimeter and area.

ENQUIRY

As part of our unit on Power, students worked in groups to design and build a model town. Along with the building, the groups needed to identify the system of government and the rules and laws. We are in the final stages of building our 'city' and look forward to presenting in front of the grade.

SCIENCE

Students have had fun learning about push, pull, gravity and friction. In the last few weeks of this unit, groups have created a 'scenario' to act out that involved one of these forces. To finish our topic, groups designed a game that had to include at least one of the forces.









Year 5/6:

Year 5/6 students have been busy with their experiment with static electricity. We conducted an experiment called Rising Ghosts where we tested a balloon with various types of materials such as tissue paper, paper towel and newspaper to see how high our ghosts could rise! We have been writing our

procedures on our static electricity experiments.

Term Four: Transition Sessions

Starting Prep is a big step for children and transitioning between Kinder and Prep can often come with mixed emotions. To ensure that all children have an opportunity to feel comfortable at Victoria Road Primary School we offer structured transition sessions.

During these sessions, we welcome children enrolled for Prep in 2020 to attend our four transition sessions. They will engage in classroom activities, meet the specialist teachers and office staff and generally get a feel for school life!

Whilst we recognise the importance of transitioning into school, we also recognise the importance of the kinder year. Kinder is such an important year and provides your children with many of the tools necessary to start school. It is for this reason that we chose not to start our transition sessions till the end of October. We have also chosen a variety of days and times. This will allow your child to experience different aspects of school life and allow them to build up to the last transition session where they will be asked to bring a packed lunch box. During this session they will also go out to the playground for recess where the teachers will closely supervise all children in one small part of the yard.




